COBALT CONFUSION

The chief veterinarian for Racing Victoria admitted the governing body should have issued warnings that standard doses of vitamin and mineral products containing cobalt could push horses' levels above the permitted threshold.

Cobalt can help increase red blood cells to help take oxygen through the body, therefore enabling a horse to perform at its peak for longer. Peter Moody, the trainer of superstar mare Black Caviar, decided to walk away from the sport earlier this year after what he felt was unfair treatment during his cobalt case. After the vet's comments, Moody tweeted: "Bit late for some."

Where Art Thou?

Inglewood Stud has confirmed the sale of their unbeaten four-year-old Oh Romeo. "There were 15 different guys who made inquiries, they went a bit crazy over him," part-owner Gus Wigley said. "He's gone to Hong Kong to a good client of Bruce Sherwin, who made an offer after his last race." he added: "It's a bit sad that he won't be racing down here, but we are running a commercial operation and we can now invest in more broodmares." The offers started rolling in for the son of Foreplay, after he bolted in at his only two starts winning by a combined margin of 18 lengths.

Feeling Jacked

The Gary Alexander-trained Querari gelding Kangaroo Jack has been awarded a 113 merit rating by the handicappers after his runaway win in the Gr 3 Spring Spree Stakes over 1200m on the Turffontein

Inside track on 2 September. Jockey Andrew Fortune said afterwards he was convinced the 4yo would get a mile and his next race is likely to be the Gr 2 Joburg Spring Challenge. The Gr1 L'Ormarin's Queen's Plate and HF Oppenheimer Horse Chestnut Stakes are medium term targets.

The industry wishes to develop new strategies to support the health, well-being, and safety of jockeys and stable staff. The ultimate goal is to improve the health and welfare of jockeys and exercise riders and any retired jockeys are encouraged to participate.
