Winning Ways host and veteran trainer James Goodman has slammed the Greyville polytrack draw bias. Goodman said that the middle inside of the track was dead but that 'misuse' was causing the outside to become a golden strip. In a damning indictment of poor management, Goodman said that vehicles were being driven on the outside strip, thus compacting it. "That's why we have this imbalance and rush to the outside and the risk of accidents. They need to sort this out – horses must be able to win from anywhere," he said.

## Zip The Lip \$10,870,000

Former Australian champion trainer Peter Moody was having a go on Twitter but has been fined A\$3,000 for statements he made on social media. His comments were regarding one of Moody's sore points – cobalt testing. The former trainer sent two tweets on Wednesday afternoon alluding to an alleged positive test in NSW by a 'leading Vic stable'.
